Curriculum is developed by F. M. University. Most of the senior faculty members participate in board of study and conducting board meeting organised by the University and suggest for the development of the curriculum.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Well furnished new conference hall facilitates vibrant academic discourses. Remedial coaching classes for slow learners are organised in different faculties. Extra coaching to advanced learners and Individualised instruction are emphasized by the faculty members for the individual development for the learners.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Test examination and Unit test examinations are held at regular interval to improve the quality of the students. Answer scripts are evaluated and performance of the students is informed accordingly for their further progress.

Teachers are encouraged to undertake research projects that are relevant to State and National requirements. One MRP is completed in this session.

Adequate number of text books and reference books and journals are purchased to meet the requirements of the students.
